As I write this the snow is falling (again) and it feels very cold. Last summer feels like a long time ago, this winter feels like it is going on for ever, and we are about to enter into the most emotionally challenging fortnight of the year. It's not the snow, nor the wind that makes the build up to Easter

challenging for Christ's pilgrim people; it's the knowledge of what will face us on Good Friday. The day we see our trusted friend, our Prince of Peace, our Mighty Counsellor, whipped and stripped and hung up high. That sky black, earth crack, no turning back, day of judgment. The day where sin and shame were borne by the one without spot nor blemish. The day when God's love was poured out for every single person, for me and for you. Jesus' own words as told to us in John's book of good news *'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends'*.

However, our story does not end on the cross nor in the grave, for we know that as well as the darkness of Good Friday, there is also the great Joy of Easter Morning as risen life bursts forth from the tomb. The cry of Why? Becomes the shout of Alleluia; the mourning has turned into singing as we sing out Praise God – Alleluia. So, I invite you to come and join us as we mark the depths of sorrow and as we sing God's praise; come and join us as we pause and stop at the cross and as we strike the first fire of Easter. Come and join us at the top of Penhill for the Sunrise service 06:30 or at any of our services on the 1st of April, come and see what the Lord has done and is doing in our churches and in our communities as we learn to walk with him, step by step along the path of life.

But that is not the only reason to sing Alleluia. For many years the parishes have been held in 'suspension' as the ministry and mission have been reshaped into new groupings of churches, and now on the 1st April we will officially become the Benefice of Lower Wensleydale. 6 parishes sharing one Rector, as we minister together and serve the villages and hamlets, the schools and the farmsteads in our own small corner of the dale. It might only be a small administrative change, but it has been passed smoothly and I hope and pray that it is a sign of how we can work together for God's Kingdom. Thanks be to God – Alleluia !

Wensleydale Filling Station

Wensleydale Filling Station has been meeting since spring 2013 and grew out of a United Service which had been running once a month for 22 years. This was initially set up as a meeting to which Christians could invite their friends and so was essentially all about telling God's story for people today. Changing to a Filling Station format has helped us to re-focus on this original vision. Each Filling Station evening starts with Coffee (or other drinks!) and cakes, with an opportunity to chat and relax. Music and worship is contemporary. Speakers are invited from around the country and there is often the opportunity to discuss some of the issues raised. There are normally about 60 people attending each month. 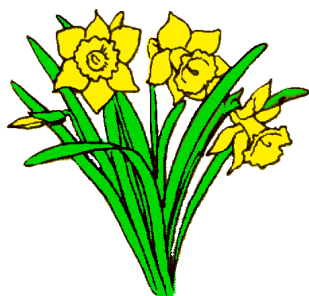
