

No Oasis - Please!

From Lisle Ryder, St Patrick's Environment Representative.

In the light of banning by the Royal Horticultural Society at its shows, please would those arranging flowers not use floral foam usually sold as Oasis. Through its use of microplastics, it causes serious pollution to the environment. Disposal of remains should not be added to compost, and particles should not be allowed into drains. Alternatives include glass beads or chicken wire scrunched into a vase.

It was fantastic to be able to gather again for our much-loved Parish Lunches - do come and join us!



Simon and Grace Stretton-Downes Simon is a dentist leading a team at a clinic at the Eternal Love Winning All (ELWA) Hospital in Monrovia. Grace is a nurse and will support Simon as well as seeking God's direction for her role in the mission field. The couple are sent by St Gregory's Church, Crakehall and are working for Serving In Mission (SIM)

Rosemary Gaven is our local contact and keeps us update with the news they send. Simon tells me that the Indian dentist he has been talking to, who worked in Liberia 2012/13 on a previous dental training course, has set his sights on coming back to help them at the Clinic

by next September, along with his wife who is also a dentist. This is something that Simon was really wanting to happen! Another good bit of news is that Eddie has sent Simon Wannie's graded certificate that he has been waiting for for the last month and that can be sent off with her application today.

Grace reports that she has made 8 sets of curtains and altered 12 sets of curtains in the last 2 weeks to welcome 3 new households to Liberia. There are some new nurses too, so they are getting together to deliver training for the National Hospital nurses. All those new folk will have hospitality from Simon and Grace.

The power has been temperamental and rain incessant on some days. It was Simon's Birthday last week so they went to a nearby resort to chill out and read for the afternoon on Saturday.

They await the birth of their first grandchild very shortly. Please pray everything will go smoothly for Alison, and that she and the baby will be healthy. They thank every one of you for your prayers.
