### The Churches Count on Nature

Two years at St Patrick's we set aside an area of the Churchyard near the road as a meadow to see what wildflowers would grow. They flourished and I started to list what I could identify. Unfortunately, those contracted to cut the grass did not have the equipment to then cut what grew so high. As summer moved into autumn the weather flattened the grass and complaints started to come about the unkempt appearance, so last year we reverted to normal cutting.

Late last year we met with Simon from the Lower Ure Conservation Trust who encouraged us to develop a management plan which we are putting into effect this year. We have erected a sign stating Conservation Area. Chris the Rector has recruited his son Bleddyn to mow the boundary and a path through to the newly renovated War Memorial. Then on 10<sup>th</sup> June during the Churches Count on Nature Week, Emma, Pandora and Rita from the Lower Ure Conservation Trust came to join me for a survey of species, mostly botanical but also a few invertebrates. They have compiled a list for us to submit to Caring for God's Acre which is part of the National Biodiversity

Network, which will also be displayed in St Patrick's. If you spot anything that can be added let me know. (lisleryder@gmail.com) On 2<sup>nd</sup> August will come the day for a big cut. Emma and a few supporters will come with the right equipment, but we need volunteers to help with a big task of raking and loading the hay onto trailers to take away for baling. Please note the date and consider offering to help with rake and fork.



In the meantime, come and follow the path. Pause and wonder at God's creation, flowers and bees and so much else if you look carefully.

God saw everything he had made, and indeed, it was very good. *Genesis 1.31.*

The tombstones tell of human stories in recent centuries. The plants tell of a broader story. Rita was asking how old the Churchyard might be for all these species to have been left undisturbed. Well, it could well go back to the twelfth century when the present Church was built, or even earlier as this may have been the site of a previous Saxon Church.

What we are doing is trying to fulfil the Church's fifth mark of mission: to strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth.
