Readings Isaiah 60.1-6, Ephesians 3.1-12, & Matthew 2.1-12

Collect O God, who by the leading of a star manifested your only Son to the peoples of the earth: mercifully grant that we, who know you now by faith, may at last behold your glory face to face; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Post Communion Lord God, the bright splendour whom the nations seek: may we who with the wise men have been drawn by your light discern the glory of your presence in your Son, the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Blessing our Homes

At Epiphany, you can bless your house by remembering the Wise Men who faithfully followed the star to find Jesus lying in a manager.

Take the chalk and mark on the lintel or doorstep of your front door 20 + C + M + B + 21Then say the words in Bold. The symbol in brackets show how the words are represented in chalk

The Three Wise Men, Caspar, (C) Melchior (M) and Balthasar (B) followed the star of God's Son who became human Two thousand (20) and twenty one years ago (21)

May Christ bless our home (++) and remain with us throughout the new year Amen (++)

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us, that same Jesus who was made flesh; and may we seek and serve him, in everyone we meet, now and forever. Amen

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten One to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Saviour. Amen





Post Communion Generous Lord, in word and eucharist we have proclaimed the mystery of your love: help us so to live out our days that we may be signs of your wonders in the world; through Jesus Christ our Saviour.
