

Simon & Grace Stretton-Downes

Simon is a dentist leading a team at a clinic at the Eternal Love Winning All (ELWA) Hospital in Monrovia. Grace is a nurse and will support Simon as well as seeking God's direction for her role in the mission field. The couple are sent by St Gregory's Church, Crakehall and are working for Serving In Mission (SIM)

Rosemary Gaven is our local contact and keeps us updated with the news they send.

Simon is happy to report that Eddie has moved into his 4th year of Dental School in Nairobi. These last two years of his course will be very much clinical-based dentistry which he already has several years experience of. His timetable has changed and he will not now be returning to Liberia for a long break as his 4th year begins this month. It is expected that he will graduate sometime in 2024. He continues to be away from his wife and young daughter.

Simon has increasingly been troubled with arthritis in his hands and is having difficulty extracting back teeth as it hurts his hands. Fortunately, he is still comfortable doing all the other dental work which remains very satisfying. Naturally, this means less time treating patients in the Clinic. He is however also teaching 3 of the 7 modules for this first semester of the new Dental School. Staff from local Cuttington University are teaching the other 4. Grace has been a great support and is helping teach one of the modules on Communication. Simon says the students are very eager to learn and are asking a lot of good questions and he is loving this new role.

On Tuesday 1st November Simon will travel with his team to the Capitol Hill Building with his team to give a presentation at a meeting with the Vice President of Liberia along with 15 institutions from around the country - rubber plantations, mining companies, agricultural colleges, etc. They are hoping that this will result in donations and, in the future, that possibly they will send students to train who could then work out of their various Institution's clinics. *As always, they thank you all for your prayers and support of them in their ministry. It is very important to them.*

And Finally

From Rev'd Chris Lawton

As the church year comes to its final 'Season' of Kingdom we are given the time to reflect on what it is to be Kingdom people, living Kingdom lives, in a Kingdom that is now but not yet, initiated but not actuated. This season starts with Remembering - All Saints - All Souls - All lost in war and conflict. And then is Crowned with Christ as our King - King of a new Kingdom. We pray for that each time we pray 'Your Kingdom Come'.

Many have asked what that Kingdom look like - how do we live like that? Jesus showed us what that Kingdom is and his 'Good News' sets it out for us in how to Be

And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.

"Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you shall be satisfied.

"Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh.

"Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you and revile you and spurn your name as evil, on account of the Son of Man! Rejoice in that day, and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven; for so their fathers did to the prophets.

"But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.

"Woe to you who are full now, for you shall be hungry.

"Woe to you who laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep.

"Woe to you, when all people speak well of you, for so their fathers did to the false prophets.

"But I say to you who hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. To one who strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also, and from one who takes away your cloak do not withhold your tunic either. Give to everyone who begs from you, and from one who takes away your goods do not demand them back. And as you wish that others would do to you, do so to them.

"If you love those who love you, what benefit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what benefit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. And if you lend to those from whom you expect to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to get back the same amount. But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he is kind to the ungrateful and the evil. Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful.

"Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you." - *Luke 6: 20-37 - ESVUK*

So this Kingdom Season - I will pause and look back, remembering all who I miss, all the saints who have gone before. And I will look forward in Hope for signs of his Kingdom here and now.
